### **UPDATE** for period 1st -7th October 2005

### 1 Important Dates

- Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> October. Millstreet Dairy Event.

#### 2 Genetic Evaluations

- New calving performance evaluations have been completed. The evaluations were based on some 1.1 million Animal Events records. This is the first time that the calving performance evaluations have gone over the 1 million mark. This milestone (1.1 million records collected since January 2002), confirms the benefits of Animal Events as a means of accurately recording large volumes of high quality data at minimal expense to farmers and the industry.
- Domestic milk production evaluations have been completed and files prepared for the next Interbull evaluation (November)
- New linear type data has been extracted and forwarded to Edinburgh University for the joint UK & Ireland evaluation of dairy linear type data. This includes records from this year's group of dairy progeny test sires.
- Development work on across breed evaluations for Calving Interval and Survival proofs is continuing.
   We expect to have new dairy proofs released to the industry ahead of the meeting scheduled for 3<sup>rd</sup>
   November.
- Development work on new beef index reports (incorporating information of beef production sub index, weaned calf sub index and calving performance sub index for all pedigree animals) has commenced. We expect these reports to be forwarded to farmers in the next number of weeks.

#### 3 Genetic Conservation

- ICBF are currently involved in conservation work for Irish Draught horses and Kerry cattle.
- Conservation work this week focused on the integration of UK & US studbooks for Irish Draughts into
  the Irish population and the calculation of inbreeding % for all animals in the 3 studbooks (Ireland, UK
  & the US). Results of this work will be presented to the project sponsors (DAF, RDS & Irish Draught
  Horse society) in the coming weeks.


#### 4 Beef Linear Scoring

- The recent introduction of the "ICBF beef linear scoring & weight recording service" has resulted in a marked increase in the number of linear score and weight records being collected by field staff in recent weeks (see figure below).
- The service is focused on "commercial" weanlings, with the objective of collecting linear score and weight records on some 5,000 weanlings over the next 4-6 weeks. The subsequent slaughtering of these animals will provide ICBF with valuable data for the estimation of genetic parameters for beef performance data.

#### 5 Milk Recording

#### **Industry Test Turnaround Sep 2005.**

Industry national average for Sep was 6.16 days. The Organisation with the best turnaround was **SWS**, with an average of **5.13 days**. Each month every MRO gets an ICBF Intranet Report on their respective turnaround performance. This gives the Organisations the details on how much time is taken in the different steps in the milk recording process.






- 13 new herds added to the database last week.
- 5,127 Teagasc ICBF permission forms have now been returned by Teagasc clients.
- The new linear scoring handheld application, and the transfer of scores over GPRS is continuing to work well.
- Breeding charts are continuing to be returned at a very good rate. Farmers have filled out a lot of data on the charts, and they are taking quite a while to key. The first reports will be returned to farmers within two weeks.
- The first 'official' farmer sale catalogue was completed this week, and feedback has been positive. ICBF and IHFA are jointly launching the catalogue next week at the ploughing. Be sure to check it out if you are on the respective stands.
