

1 Database Update

• 302 New Herds added to the database - The strong influx of new herds is a combination of Irish Angus members, and AI organisation members.



- The AI handheld trials continued in SWS and PG this week. The system is quite stable at this stage, but some good suggestions from the technicians will be incorporated into the system in January. The biggest hurdle to be faced is getting all the herds using AI signed up to the database so that a technician has the animals on the handheld prior to entering the farmers yard.
- 2393 Teagasc ICBF permission forms have now been returned by Teagasc clients. The rate of return continues to be good, with around 200 forms received in the past week. Development is continuing on the solution which will make available farmer report available on-line to those whom the farmer wishes to have access to his/her reports. The main development of this solution will be finished mid January, with 3 weeks of testing planned subsequent to that before a release of the solution in early February.
- A new batch of linear scoring schedules has been issued to the Linear scorers.
- We begun a process of measuring database availability on March 19th this year. Since then, the database has only been down for 5 minutes during office hours (9am-5.30pm).




5 Genetic evaluation update

The first trial run of the across breed evaluation of milk production traits was completed this week. The main aim of this run was to test modifications made to allow the system handle evaluation across breeds. The next test run will aim at refining the model for the accurate estimation of breeding values. Some results will be presented on January 25th. In this trial run, a total of 31,123 bulls from 41 breeds were evaluated. The number of bulls per breed ranged from 1 to 15,862 (for HO breed). However only 5 breeds had more than 20 bulls each with at least 10 daughters in two herds and a BV reliability of 70% or more. These breeds, the number of bulls per breed, the total number of daughters by these bulls used in the evaluation and the average corrected milk production of the daughters of these bulls are presented in Table 1 below.
